JUDGES: John McDougall, Virginia (Halter Show), Hank Kauffman, Florida (Halter Show) and Maryan Baker, California (Walking / Fleece On Show).

ENTRY FEE: \$50.00 per class for ALSA/ILR-SD double halter shows. \$25.00 per class for walking / fleece on show.

ENTRY DEADLINE: To be included in the show program, entries must be received by March 15, 2012. The show is limited to 300 llamas—first come-first served.

DOUBLE HALTER SHOW: This show is sanctioned by both ALSA and the ILR-Show Division. At the request of the exhibitor, the results will be sent to ALSA or the ILR-Show Division, or both. You must be an ALSA member to have the results reported to ALSA. You do not have to be a member of the ILR-Show Division to participate. The double show per llama fee (ALSA \$10) and/or (ILR \$8) will be paid by show management. All classes will be held in a single ring in front of two judges. Each judge will be evaluating separately and placing separately. No oral comments will be given. The show placements of the first judge will be announced and brought forward. The show placements of the second judge will be announced and brought forward. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons as well as Best of Show will be awarded separately as well.

STALL FEE: \$50.00 per stall without sod or \$75.00 with sod (limit of two adult llamas or three juveniles per stall). To order straw for your stall call Kevin Trimmell at Heritage Place (405) 682-4551.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Health certificates of veterinary inspection are required for all llamas traveling across Oklahoma state lines and will be inspected at sign-in.

ILR OR CLRC REGISTRATION: Exhibitors must be the registered owners and make entry in the exact names (owner and llama) as shown on the registration certificate or have written permission from the registered owners to show the animal. All breeding llamas entered in approved classes must be registered or have passed screening with the International Lama Registry (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). **Copies of the registration certificates must be sent to the show with the entry form.**

ARRIVAL: All llamas must be checked in by 6:00pm Thursday, April 12, 2012.

DEPARTURE: All llamas must depart by 10:00am Monday, April 16, 2012.

AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded for first through fifth place in each class. Ribbons and trophies will be awarded to Grand and Reserve Champions. Trophies will also be awarded for 1st place in Get of Sire and Produce of Dam classes. Best-of-Show will be awarded ribbons and premiums.

Halter Classes:

All llamas shall be present for judging with a halter and lead rope with no additional decorations. Halters shall not have tassels, pompoms or other removable decorations.

No ranch, personal, animal, organizational name, logo, or insignia shall be displayed on the exhibitor or animal during the class.

Nursing llamas cannot be accompanied in the ring by their babies or vice versa.

A Judge may dismiss animals exhibiting unruly or unsafe behavior from the ring. Dismissal can take place even before the animal gets in the ring if show personnel bring the matter to a Judge's attention.

Show management may dismiss an exhibitor and their animal from participation at the show if the exhibitor mistreats their animal.

Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the Judge's discretion.

Exhibitors are responsible for having their animal on time for showing.

An exhibitor shall not knowingly show where there is a conflict of interest with the Judge; the burden of responsibility is with the owner, exhibitor or trainer to recognize a conflict of interest.

NOTE: Handler attire should be appropriate for the class. Shoes should be appropriate for the show ring.

HALTER CLASSES:

Breeding Llamas

Wool Divisions:

Suri Fiber	Fleece hangs straight from the midline on the neck through the tail and hangs perpendicular to the ground. The fiber exhibits independent movement, high luster, independent narrow lock structure, cool, slick handle, long staple length. Locks form close to the skin, maintaining uniformity to the tips—locks can be straight, wavy, twisted or curled.
Light Wool	Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs
Medium Wool	Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool
Heavy Wool	Abundant body and neck wool with abundant leg wool below knees and hocks.

Age Divisions:

Juvenile –Jr.	5 to 9 months
Juvenile –Snr.	9 to 12 months (<i>juvenile classes may be combined, as necessary</i>)
Yearling	12 to 18 months
Intermediate	18 to 24 months
Adult	24 months and over

On a llama's birthday, the llama moves up to the next older class.

Sex Divisions:

BOTH Female and Male: Shorn animals must be shown in the wool division in which they would have been shown PRIOR to shearing. MALE classes are for intact males. FEMALE classes are for potentially fertile, breeding females.

Grand and Reserve Champion Halter Classes

These classes will be offered for each sex and wool division. These classes are composed of the llamas placing in the first two places of each division or class. Grand Champion will be selected from the first place llamas in each age division or class. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining first place llamas, and the second place llama from the Grand Champion's age division.

Get of Sire

Each entry must include three offspring by the same sire by at least two different dams. All get must first be shown in their appropriate halter class age division. While the entry is in the sire's name and awards are given to the sire, the sire is not shown in this class. The get may be decided after halter classes, but must be listed with the clerk before this class is held. If the exhibitor(s) is/are not the sire's owner, they must have written permission of the sire's owner

Produce of Dam

Each entry must include two offspring by the same dam. All produce must be shown in their appropriate halter class age division. While the entry is in the dam's name and awards are given to the dam, the dam is not shown in this class. The produce may be decided after halter classes, but must be listed with the clerk before this class is held. If the exhibitor(s) is/are not the dam's owner, they must have written permission of the dam's owner

Best of Show

The Best of Show is chosen from those breeding llamas that have received a Grand Championship from each sex and wool/fiber division.
